COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund created, **funded by city**

The Somerville City Council, in collaboration with Mayor Curtatone, has established and funded a COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund with the aim of rendering aid in this challenging time.

In response to a number of Mayor Joseph A. Curtatone's requests, the Somerville City Council last week voted on and approved a number of agenda items aimed at repurposing funds to create and fund a COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund and subsequently disburse those funds accordingly in order to support small businesses, artists and arts non-profits, and residents who have been financially distressed due to the restrictions imposed as a response to the coronavirus pandemic.

A summary provided to the City Council by the mayor outlined the steps Continued on page 4

deemed necessary at this time:

"The COVID-19 pandemic continues to have serious impacts on our local economy and the long-term well-being of our city. Except for federal funding provided at the start of the pandemic in the Spring, local governments have otherwise been on their own to address the financial needs created by the pandemic. At this point, the federal government continues to debate but not provide further assistance, and the state government has no plans to provide additional financial support beyond the local aid in the FY21 state budget. With vaccines on the way, the pandemic will reach an end - likely in 2021. Right now, we need to protect our community from COVID-19 and provide financial support so our local economy will still be here as the pandemic comes to an end. We have moved to close businesses and programs where public health needs require it. But, we need a bridge of financing that can ensure that Somerville remains the city that we know and love. This will impact our community, our residents, and our future local revenues including property and meals taxes. Without financial assistance, we are likely to have more bankruptcies, more evictions, and we risk reopening our economy without the small businesses, the arts community and the diverse neighborhoods that makes Somerville a great place to live, work, play, and raise a family. We need to provide support in three areas:

from federal grants and \$700,000 in fee waivers. With the need to close businesses to protect public health, we need additional support. The COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund will specifically assist businesses that have remained closed, been recently closed, or had operations significantly reduced due to COVID-19 restrictions. This program will be funded at \$5,000,000 by transferring money from the following sources:

- Rainy Day Stabilization \$1,843,117
- Capital Stabilization \$1,000,000
- + Street Reconstruction Stabilization \$1,500,000
- Wynn Casino FY21 Payments \$ 300,000
- Water Transportation Stabilization \$ 150,306
- Algonquin Mitigation Stabilization \$ 132,359
- + Small Business Assistance Stabilization \$74,218
- Note: We intend to replenish the stabilization accounts once

For residents in need:

To date \$2.56 million has been allocated for rental assistance, and just over \$400,000 for childcare programs, food programs, and workforce development. These funds have been provided to our non-profit community. In addition, we have increased capacity at the Office of Housing Stability and local non-profits to assist Somerville residents with applying for state rental assistance. We estimate that the local funds provided will sustain our need through the next few months but will likely need additional funds soon. At that time, additional federal and state funds may be available. But, if they are not made available for these needs, we may need to return to the City Council for additional support."

After creating the fund, the City Council subsequently approved the following repurposing and appropriation measures in response to the request:

• Appropriation of \$1,843,117 from the Rainy Day Stabiliza-

• Repurposing and transfer of \$150,306 from the Water Transportation Public Safety Stabilization Fund to the COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund.

• Repurposing and transfer of \$132,359 from the Algonquin Mitigation Stabilization Fund to the COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund.

• Repurposing and transfer of \$74,218 from the Small Business Assistance Stabilization Fund to the COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund.

• Appropriation of \$5,000,000 from the COVID-19 Small Business Emergency Relief Fund to provide temporary support to businesses experiencing substantial decline as a result of the pandemic.

• Acceptance of a payment of \$200,000 from the Wynn Casino Surrounding Community Agreement to the COVID 19 Stabilization Fund to provide

 Appropriation of \$291,000 from the COVID-19 Stabilization Fund for Testing and Contract Tracing.

Advesa MA reaches out to Somerville



Advesa MA, Inc. group held a community outreach meeting last week, introducing to Somerville residents the plan that is in the works to bring a cannabis retailer to the city.

Advesa is an Economic Empowerment Priority Applicant that is looking to provide the community with modern cannabis, as well as education surrounding the medical benefits of using it. This is an effort to help break to stigma centered on the drug that has been around for decades.

Throughout the years, individuals have been negatively impacted by laws; hit with charges related to cannabis, whether it be distribution and/or possession. Many have even faced incarceration. As a result, it is difficult for those to progress in the working world with these visible blemishes on their record.

Advesa will serve as a solid foundation for people who are looking gain stability in their life. "Advesa's mission as a job incubator in Somerville goes beyond hiring these individuals," explains Jessica Pelletier, a principle of the company. She says, "Advesa will pay living wages and aid individuals in gaining job skills that they can use as a springboard to enter into other sectors of the cannabis Industry." Advesa's presence



in the community will certainly help change the narrative for many people's stories, by providing them with a chance to grow within the industry.

Location in an essential element of any business, and this holds true for the forthcoming cannabis retailer. With its location in Ball Square, there is anticipation for steady traffic. "We have high hopes that our location to the Ball Square Green Line Extension will help us fulfill our plan to be an environmentally conscious company that plays a key role in the economic development of the Ball Square district following it completion," says Pelletier. "Being next to the train station will deeply migrate local vehicle traffic concerns, and encourage walking, biking, and the use of public transportation." Bike racks will be available for visitors as well. Also, deliveries will be available by the retailer. The drop-offs will not take place during times of heavy traffic.

The target date for the opening of the dispensary is based on its progress with the state, as they must wait to get approved for a license. The community meeting regarding permit in the city will take place next month. There is not set date for this at this time.





The Yule Train By Bob (Monty) Doherty

One day in the winter of 1842, a train rolled through this city. Among its passengers was a young English author who, shortly after his four-month visit to America, would change Christmas forever. The coach or omnibus, as they were often called, was the first American train he ever boarded. It was the Boston and Lowell, the first major railroad built in New England.



After his country tour, the young Charles Dickens reflected back and said his most enjoyable time was his slow train excursion to and from Lowell. It was the year Somerville broke away from Charlestown. While on the ride, he took copious notes on everything he saw. His first stop in Somerville was at Washington Street and Tufts Street where he saw Mclean Hospital atop Cobble Hill and a factory that manufactured railroad spikes, doornails and knockers. These and other observations on and off the train would be published in his novel, American Notes.

The train brought the author past the snow-covered pastures of what is now the base of Prospect Hill where General George Washington and his infant army spent their first Christmas. It also passed Central Hill where hero Captain Nathan Hale spent his last Christmas. Next was Winter Hill where Hessian/German prisoners first celebrated Christmas bringing the tradition of Christmas trees to America. Dickens saw a land that under the puritanical law of Governor Bellingham, the successor of John Winthrop,

Tackling food insecurity on a long-term basis

Lisa Brukilacchio, a member of the Cambridge Health Alliance and Director of the Somerville Community Health Agenda, recently spoke at length about local efforts being made to provide food to those in need during the pandemic.

As Brukilacchio made clear, the Commonwealth and local agencies have been working diligently to help those in the food-insecure population, but the battle remains uphill and, unfortunately, will only be more difficult through the upcoming winter months.

One of the first topics Brukilacchio spoke about was how the need to support the food-insecure population has changed concurrently with the pandemic. She mentioned various metrics that highlight how the need for support has increased, two of which in particular reflect the change: there has been a 59% increase in food-insecurity in Massachusetts since 2018, and the total number of SNAP recipients has increased by 19.5% between October 2019 and October 2020.

Brukilacchio also mentioned that the Greater Boston Food Bank has been distributing over two million pounds of food per week, which is an astonishing quantity to contemplate. However, she said that even this amount of food is not meeting the need.

Brukilacchio explained that the most effective method of safely getting food to people has been delivery services. Here in Somerville, Project Soup has been leading the charge in the delivery services, working together with Cambridge's Food For Free Committee.

The city and schools have collaborated as well to provide delivery services to families and children. Brukilacchio also spoke about the success of the Off Their Plate program that has helped feed health-care workers, the people who have truly been on the front line throughout this whole ordeal. She said in Somerville alone this initiative has delivered over 5,000 meals.

Brukilacchio also praised Somerville restaurants, Daddy Jones and Dark Horse, for helping deliver food to those in need and working with the schools to get food out to families. Given how difficult the pandemic has been on restaurants, they along with any others that have been helping get food out there certainly deserve the community's gratitude.

Brukilacchio also spoke about alternatives to delivery services. Unfortunately, sit-down meals that tend to occur around this time of year have not been an option, but there have been grab-and-go events such as Come to the Table. Hardy Meals and Project Soup have also hosted similar grab-and-go events.

When talking about the outlook for the future, Brukilacchio said that the recovery time will be lengthy, and that it is difficult to truly give specifics. Even as we approach the end of this year, old unknowns persist and new ones appear each day that complicate the pandemic. For those among the food-insecure population, who even without a pandemic have tremendous challenges to contend with, the current situation will inevitably increase the need for support. However, Brukilacchio did say that real movement has been made among local and broader government to

support this community. She cited the City Council's recently passed resolution to call on Governor Baker to streamline the process for SNAP beneficiaries, and she lauded Jim McGovern for being a longtime advocate for food-access activism as well. Examples like these of governmental support and volunteerism do brighten the outlook, but it requires persistence.

Baker-Polito administration announces further measures to stop the spread of COVID-19

On Tuesday of this week the Baker-Polito Administration announced further restrictions to help stop the spread of COVID-19 in the Commonwealth, including new capacity and gathering limits. These measures will go into effect on Saturday, December 26 and will remain in effect until noon on January 10, 2021.

Read the emergency order at: https://www.mass.gov/doc/ covid-19-order-59/download <u>Capacity Limits</u> Effective Saturday, December 26, most industries in Massachusetts will be subject to a 25% capacity limit including:

- Restaurants (based on permitted seating capacity)
- + Close Contact Personal Services
- Theatres and Performance Venues
- + Casinos
- Office Spaces
- Places of Worship
- Retail Businesses
- Driving and Flight Schools
- Golf Facilities (for indoor
- spaces)
- Libraries
- Lodging (for common areas)

• Arcades and Indoor Recreation Businesses

- Fitness Centers and Health Clubs
- Museums, Cultural Facilities and Guided Tours

Workers and staff will not count towards the occupancy count for restaurants, places of worship, close contact personal services, and retail businesses.

All other rules and restrictions in each sector-specific guidance will remain in effect.


Gatherings Limit

Effective Saturday, December 26, the gatherings limits will be updated. Indoor gatherings will be limited to 10 people. Outdoor gatherings will be limited to 25 people outside.

The gatherings limit applies to private homes, event venues and public spaces.

Elective Surgeries

The Department of Public Health released updated guidance to hospitals around nonessential, elective invasive procedures. To preserve health care personnel resources, effective 12:01am on December 26, all hospitals are directed to postpone or cancel all nonessential inpatient elective invasive procedures in order to maintain and increase inpa-



tient capacity. Hospitals shall make every effort to preserve their inpatient capacity by cancelling nonessential electives and redeploying staff.

Patients are reminded to still seek necessary care at their hospital or from their health care provider.

Davis Square exhibit focuses on Somerville trees

"Noticing the trees around us – on our commutes, in our yards, parks, or neighborhoods – is the first step to valuing them," and the rationale behind a Somerville tree-themed photo exhibit entitled *R.O.O.T. (Recognizing Our Oldest Trees)*, now on display in the Inside-Out Gallery, the outdoor gallery beside the Davis Square CVS, where it can be viewed safely from the sidewalk.

The exhibit was organized by a group of Somerville residents hoping to encourage viewers to look more closely at the trees around them, to help protect and conserve these trees, and to learn more about trees living in an urban environment. The photographs were selected not only for their aesthetic qualities, but also to draw attention to the beauty and environmental benefits of Somerville trees and to acknowledge the places where human activity often comes into conflict with these trees.

The organizers – Somerville residents Kerrie Kemperman, Deb Pacini, Renee Scott and Melissa McWhinney – have been concerned about tree losses across the city.

"The exhibit is motivated by our understanding that trees are a valuable natural resource often thought of as expendable," they noted. "Trees tend to be cut or removed whenever they interfere with human goals: power lines, roads and train lines, sidewalks, housing construction... which are not inherently bad reasons to cut down a tree, but it is worth considering these as opportunities to work around trees that are already well established in a particular spot."



The Somerville R.O.O.T. exhibit was produced with the assistance and support of the Somerville Arts Council and is on display until January 15, 2021.

"If we are good stewards, trees will live hundreds of years, cleaning the air, decreasing flooding, and cooling city air temperatures on hot summer days," the ROOT collective noted. "Trees provide shelter and food for many types of wildlife, and grace our lives with their beauty."

Sam Engelstad has been a resident of Prospect Hill in Somerville for 22 years. He wonders what bureaucratic hiccup enabled the unique decision to allow the sidewalk to be built around this tree, thus protecting it, instead of cutting the poor thing down.

Jeanine Farley is an educational writer living in Somerville. She is a hobbyist photographer, who enjoys capturing Somerville's many species of creatures. Last summer in Somerville, she photographed some Golden Northern bumblebees, which might become extinct in a generation or two. Plant native, folks! Save our native bees.

Free at-home kids activities for the holidays

The holiday break sounds like a magical time with fewer commitments, lazy days cozying up with hot cocoa, and quality, quiet time with family. But in reality, cabin fever sets in and kids complain there's nothing to do.

Even worse, they are glued to their screens all day long and never get off the couch. Most parents agree that kids are happier when they are active, but with so many indoor activity centers closed it can be challenging to find engaging activities that are fun, safe, and don't require expensive equipment.

To help parents, youth sports and learning experts at Skyhawks Sports Academy and STEM recommend five fun activities to get children active during the holiday break. They're easy to learn and use objects found in most households. Bonus: there may or may not be a STEM-learning hidden in these activities, so it's a win-win.

Farthest Football Throw:

We all know a key skill for a quarterback is to throw the football accurately and for distance, but even the pros fall short or overthrow the ball. So, grab a football and a measuring tape and start a fun competition to see which family member can throw the ball the farthest. Have each person try it 3 times and record the results. This activity will also teach your children math skills as they calculate the distance between the farthest and the shortest throws.

Glove Grip Test:

Notice how many football players wear gloves during the game? It's not because they're cold, it's because the gloves give them a better grip while catching and passing the ball. To test it out, gather different types of gloves you may find around the house: sports gloves, boxing dish cleaning gloves, or even disposable gloves. Try passing the football and catching it from different distances and with different gloves to notice the difference in grip and accuracy when throwing and catching.

Basketball Tower Challenge:

Make your child an engineer for the day by making basketball towers. All you need are a few easy-to-find materials: newspaper, masking tape, and a basketball. The goal is to roll up several sections of newspaper tightly to create poles for a scaffolding that will be strong enough to hold the basketball without tipping over. This will teach children problem-solving skills and critical thinking. In addition, it emphasizes the use of soft skills such as teamwork and how to deal with and recover from failure.

Playing Card Fitness:

This is a fun activity with simple exercises that is enjoyable for the whole family and can be played indoors in any size room. All you need are a deck of cards. To play, each participant picks a card, and depending on the suit and value on the card, everyone completes the exercise. Every suit represents a different exercise like hearts = pushups, diamonds = jumping jacks, clubs = sit-ups, and spades = squats; and the value on the card represents the rep count like number 2, 9 =2 to 9 reps, face card = 11 reps and ace = 12 reps. To make it more fun and a little competitive, see who can complete all the rounds first to decide a winner or add up all the reps to see who did the most.

Fireworks in a Jar:

This is a great project for younger children. Take a clear glass and fill it with equal parts of oil and water. The oil floats to the top because it is less dense than water. Then add a drop of food coloring and watch as the



bursts once it hits the water. This demonstrates that food coloring is denser than oil because it sinks. Experiment with different amounts of water, oil, and food coloring, and encourage questions: you can always Google the answers.





Q&A: Can turning 65 impact MassHealth eligibility?

A: Yes, the eligibility rules for MassHealth change in a couple of important ways when people turn 65.

The income limit goes down when you turn 65. There are some people who have had MassHealth their whole life, due to a disability, and then they turn 65 and they are no long eligible, because their income is a little too high.

The exact number often changes from year to year. The Aging Information Center at Somerville-Cambridge Elder Services provides free guidance on Mass-Health eligibility, and I would advise residents who are turning 65 and have questions to get in touch.

The other big change is that when you are under 65 there is no asset limit. MassHealth does not look at your savings – you can have a large bank account or trust or things like that. But once you turn 65, they look at your assets. You can only have up to \$2,000 in savings, although there are certain types of assets that are not counted towards this limit. That number has not changed in a long time, and there have been efforts to increase it, but it hasn't gone anywhere.

It can be very helpful to call the Aging Information Center before turning 65, as there may be some simple steps that can allow you maintain MassHealth coverage. Depending on the types of assets a person has, we may also refer them to an elder law attorney for further guidance.

If someone has already lost their MassHealth after turning 65, we may also be able to help them to get back onto Mass-Health, depending on their financial situation. We get calls from people about this, and unfortunately, it is usually after the fact. They'll lose their MassHealth coverage and not know why, so they'll call us. As with many things in life, planning ahead and speaking to someone before the loss of insurance coverage can help things go smoother.

He chronicled passengers and their stories while huddled around potbelly stoves for warmth. The thick, grey smoke generated by the heaters created what he described as eerie, ghost-like images throughout the train.

In Lowell, he saw the arduous plight of many mill workers. He had no trouble relating to them because he had been forced to work in a London blacking mill from the age of nine to eleven to help free his parents from debtor's prison. Between the thought of ghosts, working children, door spikes and knockers, and the banning of Christmas, his train ride through Somerville may have given Dickens food for thought.

The next year he published A Christmas Carol, which was wildly successful and critically acclaimed. It incorporated the themes of winter ghosts, door spikes and the social injustices of industry. Many motion pictures and countless other adaptations have been based on his treasured tale which created the phrase ... Merry Christmas!



'The Girl in the Boston Box' by Chuck Latovich

The Girl in the Boston Box By Chuck Latovich 435 pp. available on Amazon

During the ongoing pandemic, many of us have rediscovered the joy of getting lost in a good book. Especially, for me, this means a mystery. *The Girl in the Boston Box* by Cambridge writer Chuck Latovich is a perfect present for yourself or someone you know.


Steeped in Boston lore and landmarks, the book follows two apparently unrelated characters, Mark, a 40-something gay man who works as a tour guide driving Duck Boats for a living, and Caitlyn, a graduate student in architectural history at Harvard.

When the book opens, Mark's brother, from whom he's been estranged for decades, has been murdered, leaving few clues other than the mysterious words "Boston Box" on a scrap of paper in his apartment. The police have contacted Mark to identify his brother's body, and because it seems Mark stands to inherit a hefty sum of money his brother left behind.

From the start, things don't go quite as planned. Mark soon learns that other shadowy figures are laying claim to his brother's money. Meanwhile, in a totally separate storyline, across the river in Cambridge, Caitlyn is studying 19 buildings with hidden rooms called Boston Boxes. Though some of these rooms seem to have been used by the Underground Railroad to hide runaway slaves in pre-Civil War days, as Caitlyn delves further, she uncovers dark secrets and shocking crimes involving Boston's past.

The story of how these two strangers – Mark and Caitlyn – eventually connect is what makes up some of the excitement of *The Girl in the Boston Box*. The book alternates with galloping suspense between Mark and Caitlyn until their stories finally converge.

As an exciting mystery, this book rates five stars, but it's more than just a thriller. I can always tell I



love a book when the characters stay with me long after I've finished reading. I found this with both characters, but especially with Mark. At the beginning he's somewhat down and out. His long-term boyfriend has dumped him. He has no family and seemingly few friends. He lives in a shabby Brighton apartment and is clinging to his job as a Duck Boat driver.

Yet despite this, Mark still has the ability to laugh at himself and to hope for better times. All in all, he's a totally endearing character who bumbles through Boston trying to piece together the clues to his brother's murder. Far from a one-dimensional character, Mark can be at times self-pitying, fearful, and petty, and at other times brave, noble, and selfless. I laughed out loud many times at his spot-on, sometimes ironic, observations of modern-day Bostonians and Cantabrigians. If you want to lose yourself in a truly absorbing book, pick up *The Girl in the Boston Box*. You won't regret it!


